

Position: Stagiaire / Internship

Overview

HealthforAnimals is the global animal health association representing the developers and manufacturers of animal health products (vaccines, parasiticides, antibiotics, diagnostics, digital and other products).

We are seeking an intern with research experience to support our team starting in early 2021. The successful applicants' primary role will be to undertake 2-3 research projects on animal disease, medicine use, sustainability and pet health. This will involve:

- Desk research of existing literature in peer-reviewed and other publications.
- Phone discussions with veterinary science experts.
- Weekly check-ins with HealthforAnimals staff to present progress and discuss direction.
- Drafting a 5-10-page report at the conclusion of each project summarizing findings.

The role is an opportunity to learn from experts and create tangible outputs that reflect your skills.

Desired education, experience and skills

- Degree (or be enrolled in a program) related to animal science, veterinary medicine or similar fields
- Ability to work independently and meet agreed-upon deadlines
- Good interpersonal skills and ability to 'ask the right questions' of experts
- Demonstrable research experience
- Clear, concise writing skills
- English fluency is a must

Commitment and compensation

- Position will be 35 hours per week with a flexible schedule.
- Due to the pandemic, the internship will be remote with interaction done via phone, mail, zoom.
- Successful applicant will work with colleagues in Brussels and Washington, DC.
- Compensation will be equivalent to the general stagiaire rates in Brussels.
